Properties with Public Access

The properties offer recreational opportunities in the form of hiking trails, walking paths, and scenic vistas. They are open to the public, free-of-charge. Note: In some cases, the land is privately owned; please respect landowners' privacy.

Hiking Trails

The Georges Highland Path is a 50-mile network of conservation trails built and maintained by the Georges River Land Trust. The Jones Brook Area segment in St. George includes the Fort Point Trail, the Jones Brook Trail, and the Town Forest Trail. These trails are open to the public for use, free-of-charge. Neighborhood Access Paths

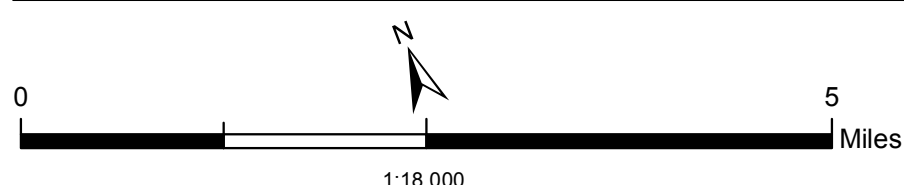
These paths are provided by owners to neighbors and those who are close enough to walk to the footpaths. The footpaths offer shorefront, vistas, locales for artwork, and other opportunities for outdoor experiences in special places. Public Landings

St. George has two public landings. One is located in Tenants Harbor and the other is in Port Clyde.

Contours

10-foot contour lines based on a composite data layer of 2-foot contours created from lidar data collected in Maine between 2006 and 2013. Due to the fact that some areas were collected at high tide, some areas do not have contours that have a zero-value. Vertical accuracy is 12 centimeters or better.
