Public Comment:

Discussion of STG school building status/update (Mike Felton): somebody donated \$10,000 to the school to go towards an architect. They are waiting for a bid from architects to do a needs assessment. The Facilities Committee met last week and talked a lot about adding Voc. Tech for students and the community as a whole. They would like any timeline that the architect creates to include July and August so our summer population is included in the discussion. When the needs assessment is completed, there will be a community forum. If some of the needs of the Rec Department overlap with the schools needs, this will be a good time to get that information out there. It will probably take about a year to gather information, create a preliminary plan, and budget. Missy stated that the Rec committee's needs might not be as pressing as the school's. We would like to investigate what the community wants/needs in a Rec Center. Maybe they won't even want one. Mike would like us to keep the communication open. Ben recommends that we complete a Rec Needs Assessment. There is some money in the budget if we want to mail something out, which would ensure every taxpayer receives it. We can also do something online and set a table up at St George Days. Bryan thinks it would be a good idea to show a concept design at St. George Days. It may be difficult to have something so quickly, but we could have results from the survey to display. This will be tabled until the next meeting.
