Gary suggested having a batting cage for our kids to practice hitting. (goal for next year?) Jaime reports a successful Little League season for the boys, pitching and hitting will be the goals for that group next year.

4. Facilities

2. Summer Programming

Ben will leave Wiffleball equipment in the dug-out.

Oceanside Little League is offering 'Sandlot" in Thomaston where adults will supervise, but kids will run the games.

3. Soccer Program

Expecting to return as much as possible to regular soccer in the fall. With numbers from the past, we expect to have co-ed teams.

K-2 soccer will look different. They will just play within the town and set up small scrimmages for grades 1-2. We are recommending that K does not play. Almost always it ends in tears, and they are too little to play with 2nd graders. Ben recommends that we accept Kinders on a case by case basis. IF there is interest, we can offer clinics.

Jake Miller asked about signage to put on the scoreboard. Since the boosters funded the board, Ben recommended First National fund skating rink upgrade like lights, leveling the lot, etc

Will Minery (8th grader) spoke with Ben today to ask about putting a skate park (quarter pipe) at Collins Park. How do we put a park there and make sure kids behave and treat it well? Kids would need to have ownership and agree to take care of it and be respectful: clean trash, respectful language, park hours, etc. Would the skate park be better suited at the baseball field?
