## MINIMUM ROAD STANDARDS TOWN OF ST. GEORGE, MAINE

In March 1969, the Town voted to adopt the following minimum standards to be met before accepting a private road as a town road:

- 1. Petitioner (s) shall present a scaled drawing of the road and right of way, prepared by a licensed civil engineer or surveyor, to the Board of Selectmen, locating the road with reference to existing roads, waterfronts, etc., and showing all abutting property lines.
- 2. Petitioner (s) shall deed to the town a right of way that shall be at least the same width as the town road from which entrance is made, except that a minimum of two (2) rods and a maximum of three (3) rods shall be required.
- 3. Petitioner (s) shall present to the Board of Selectmen written waiver of liability signed, and notarized, by each of the abutting land owners.
- 4. The road shall:
  - (a) Be of such width that two cars can pass anywhere on its length.
  - (b) Be excavated and filled as necessary, to ensure that all soft material is replaced with suitable compacted material.
  - (c) Be ditched laterally and culverted transversely (and laterally where necessary) to take care of maximum water runoff.
