Invasive plants to watch for in Springtime



Yes, it's still winter but in March we can already be on the lookout for one of the most aggressive invasives, namely, Japanese Barberry. Its green leaves (but the purple leaf varieties can also be apparent), are among the first to come out, so it is easy to spot, and it is throughout our peninsula.

Japanese barberry is a thorny shrub, introduced for hedgerow and other plantings in 1875. By 1910 it was recognized as a frequent garden escapee. Most robust in full sun but will germinate, grow, and produce fall berries even in full shade. Found in forests, forest edges, old fields, as well as disturbed habitats. If you have woods or thickets on your property, check the edges for this invasive.

Japanese Barberry also has some additional surprises. Ticks love to live under it! So, before you do anything with Barberry be sure you have tick protection. Also due to their early and late leaves, can reduce many native ephemerals (spring flowering perennials) that we love to see on the woodland floor.

Since it is a very fast spreader, helped by birds scattering its seeds, it is important to eliminate it whenever you find it Small plants and seedlings may be pulled up by the roots when soil is moist (wear thick gloves!); larger plants can be cut, but re-sprouting will occur. Persistent cutting or mowing multiple times during the growing season over several years may kill the plant, but diligence is required. Mowing can prevent seedlings from establishing. Flame-weeder (propane torch) can be effective if used in spring and followed-up during the summer to treat survivors. Herbicide is highly effective as foliar applications (glyphosate or triclopyr solution) anytime the plant has leaves, including early in the spring before native species leaf out, thus reducing chance of collateral damage. Cutstump applications are possible but not recommended due to numerous small stems. For plants too tall to spray, a combination of cutting in year 1 followed by foliar herbicide in year 2 is effective.

TECH TIPS with Bill Batty

In our last "Town Tech Tip" I introduced you to the town's (relatively) new cloud-based permit tracking software. This "iWorq" software allows us to quickly and easily keep track of building and plumbing permits.

"Why that's great, Bill" you say, rolling your eyes. "How does that help me?" Well Mr./Mrs. Taxpayer/Resident, here are a few ways where this new software can save you time and even save you some money!

Let's suppose you want to add a new shed to your property. That requires a building permit. Part of the permitting process is to determine your lot coverage—how much (in percent) of your lot is covered by impermeable surfaces. You will need to know how many feet of road frontage you have. You'll need to know what the square footage of your buildings are. While you could do the math and measuring to figure those things out, there is a far quicker way to get that information. You could call or email your friendly town clerks, and ask us to email you a copy of the most recent building permit for your property. Chances are, all that information you need will already be on that permit. That will save you a bunch of time by having that data at your ready disposal.

Here's another possible time saver. Let's say you're driving through town, and you notice a lovely new addition on a building, and you'd like to have a similar addition put on your house. While you could ask around, or look at a tax map to get the owners address, and then send them a letter asking for the information, this new system allows us to quickly look up a building project and email some details straight to you. You could contact the town office, and we could email you a copy of their building permit. You most likely would be able to get the contractor's name, phone, and even an estimated cost. Sometimes even some plans or sketches will be available.

Would you like some money saving ideas? How about this... You've purchased a home here in St. George, and the time has come for your septic tank to be pumped. Where exactly is the tank? How many feet out from the house is it? Where is the access hatch, now buried under the soil? While you could hire the septic crew to locate the components for you, what if you had a copy of the septic plan? It's possible we have it on file at the town office, and could quickly print or email you a copy.

With this new system, having all those permits related to your property may prove extremely useful when it comes time to buy or sell property here in Saint George. With just a few clicks we can print or email previous copies of all the permits dealing with a piece of property. This has already proved very popular with many realtors, who can say "Email me everything you have on XYZ property," and it's easily done. Potential buyers can see all the improvements done, and sellers can quickly provide tax cards, septic plans, and everything else. It really is a fantastic system!
