Returnable Bottle Room

5¢ soda cans and bottles, beer cans and bottles. and 15¢ wine and liquor bottles go in the bottle room.

Each month a St. George non-profit organization redeems the returnables donated by citizens and uses the money they receive for their organization.

Wood

Lumber: no pressure-treated or burnt or charred wood

White Goods*

Appliances such as refrigerators and freezers (doors removed) washers, dryers, ovens, water heaters, other metals

Trees & Brush

No stumps, grass, leaves or weeds
