Returnable Bottle Room

5¢ soda cans and bottles, beer cans and bottles, and 15¢ wine and liquor bottles go in the bottle room.

Each month a St. George non-profit organization redeems the returnables donated by citizens and uses the money they receive for their organization.

Wood

Lumber: no pressure-treated or burnt or charred wood

White Goods*

Appliances such as refrigerators and freezers (doors removed) washers, dryers, ovens, water heaters, other metals

Trees & Brush

No stumps, grass, leaves or weeds

Metal Cans

Food or Beverage Cans
Pie Plates
Clean Foil
Metal lids from glass jars

Cans should be rinsed out

No Aerosol Cans or
Paint Cans.

Glass

Clear or colored glass
food or beverage jars
and bottles; covers
removed.
Ceramic sinks and similar
fixtures.

Jars should be rinsed out.

No light bulbs of any kind
No window or auto glass

Rigid Plastic

Toys
Laundry baskets
Buckets
Plant pots
Lawn furniture
Milk crates, etc.

No food, chemical or
hazardous material con-
tainers

No PVC, hoses or other
pipes

Fee Structure

Tires 16" and under.....	\$2.00 ea.	Antifreeze	\$5.00/gal.
Tires 17" to 20"	5.00 ea.	Demo – pickup truck load	20.00
Oversized Tires.....	10.00 ea.	Demo (3 to 10 yd load).....	30.00/yd.
Upholstered Furniture	5.00 ea.	Demo (beyond 10 yd load)....	50.00/yd.
Mattresses or Box Springs	5.00 ea.	Tree and Brush	20.00/yd.
White Goods	10.00 ea.	Asphalt Shingles.....	25.00/yd.
Contaminated Oil*	\$5.00/gal.	Sheetrock.....	25.00/yd.

Contaminated Oil means oil mixed with antifreeze, water, rags, filters, or bilge water.*

Bagged Household Refuse

Goes in the compactor
No waste oil, liquid waste, car or truck batteries, animal carcasses, drums with waste such as ash, asbestos, or industrial waste.

Compostable Materials

Food scraps including vegetable and fruit peels, coffee grounds, etc. go in the bin beside the compactor.
No meat, fish or dairy products.
